## Transport Access Guide

The Kingdom Culture Christian School is located on Kembla Street in Arncliffe.

We are fortunate to have a number of different transport options for students travelling to school. Based on our 2024 transport assessment:

21% of students live within a **15 minute walk**, less than **1.2km** to school



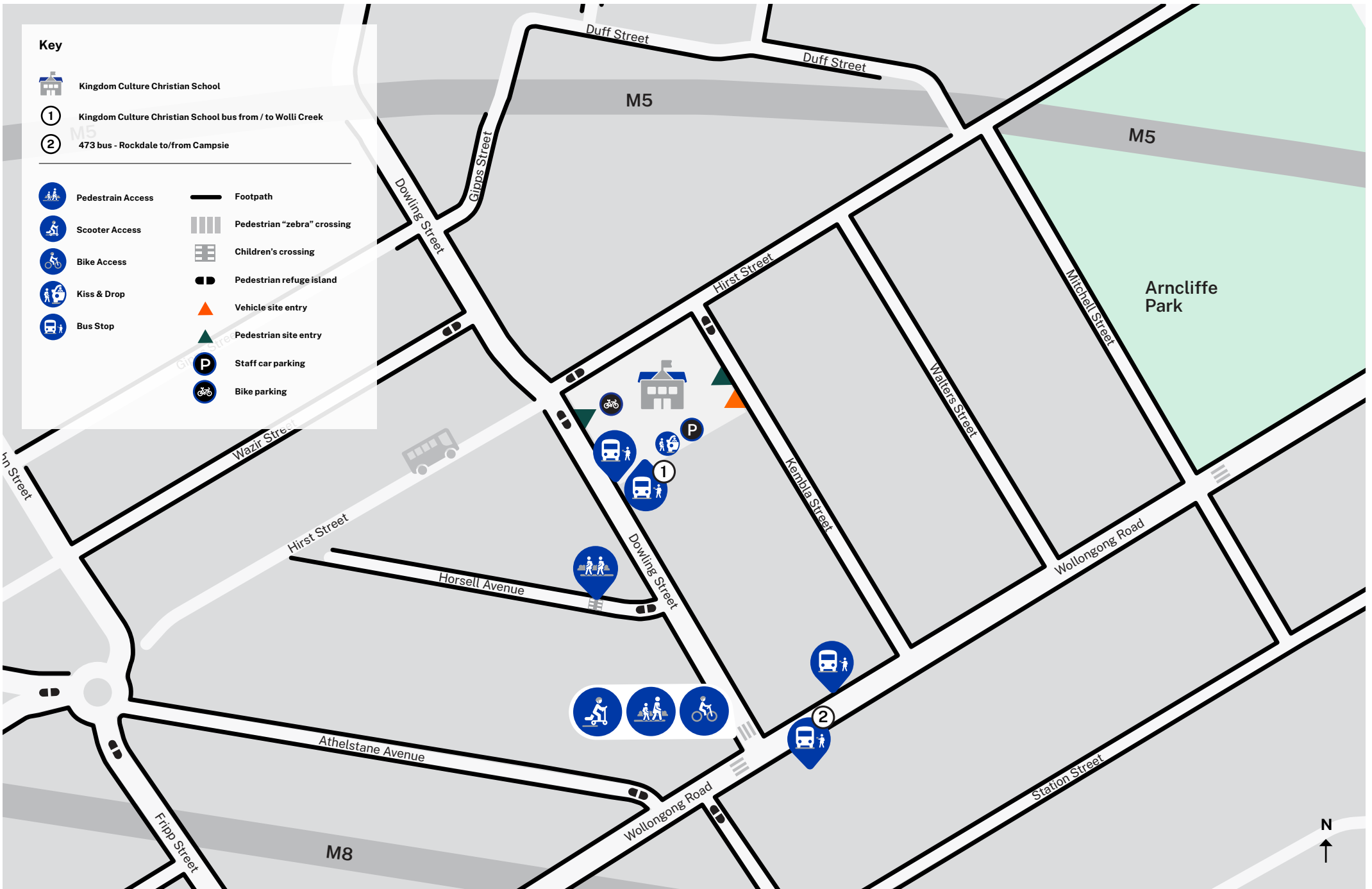
Further **33%** live within riding distance, **1.2 – 2.3km** to school

Kingdom Culture Christian School is making the shift to become an active transport school. This means that walking, biking and public transport will be the main way that our students travel to school.

Parents and carers have a key role to play in helping students walk, bike and ride safely to school. This guide can help with information about public transport, bicycling and safety tips. If you have any questions about transport that are not answered by this guide, please contact the office and we can help with additional information.



## Dropping off & picking up students

### Code of Conduct



The beginning and end of the school day are busy times for pedestrians and drivers outside schools. Model safe and considerate pedestrian and driver behaviours for your child and our students.

If you must drive, keep children safe by following the Road Rules at all times:

- Always give way to pedestrians, particularly when entering and leaving driveways
- Reduce vehicle speeds
- Never double park - it is illegal and puts children at risk
- Never do a U-turn or a three point turn outside the school as it puts children at risk of harm
- Never call out to students from across the road - it is very dangerous
- Do not pick up or drop off students at bus stops
- Do not block driveways
- Park responsibly, even if you have to walk further to the school gate.

## Drop-off and pick-up procedures



In order to assist with a safe and smooth drop-off and pick-up, we ask that you:

- Follow the yellow line marking. Stay between yellow lines for better manoeuvrability.
- If needed, use the yellow painted spaces at the end of the car park to help you turn around.
- For afternoon pick-up: have the name of your child / children displayed on your windscreen.
- Stop at the dedicated drop-off and pick-up bays. Stay clear of the pedestrian zebra crossing.
- Stay in the car. A KCCS staff member will help student(s) to the car.
- For afternoon pick-up: If necessary due to delays in a student's arrival to the waiting area, KCCS staff may ask you to go around and join the back of the queue to let other cars leave the car park.
- At any time, please be mindful of pedestrians and other car park user and follow KCCS staff instructions.

## Using public transport and school buses



Bus services are available for students who live too far from school to walk. The school is served by the following bus routes:

- Private school bus – to/from Wolli Creek
- Route 473 (regular bus) – Rockdale to/from Campsie

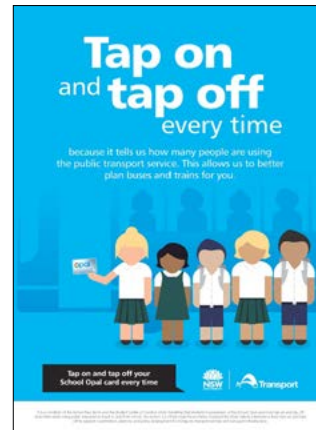

## Which Opal Card do students need?



Students are eligible for free or reduced cost travel



### Free travel to school

Some students are eligible for free travel to school:

- K-2 student
- Year 3-6 student living more than 1.6km in a straight line, or 2.3km on-path walking distance from the school
- Year 6-12 student living more than 2km in a straight line, or 2.9km on-path walking distance from the school.

The card is only valid for travel from home to school and from school to home.

### Discounted travel to school

If you are not eligible for the free travel to school, a school term bus pass may be available for \$55/term.
